

The new EU Organic Regulation 2018/848 aims to encourage the sustainable development of organic production in the EU, guarantee fair competition for farmers and operators, prevent fraud and unfair practices, and improve consumer confidence in organic products. It revises and strengthens the controls system, trade regime and production rules, and overhauls the previous regime in place since 2007.

The new compliance scheme for organic imports will apply from 1 January 2025, after a threeyear transition period since the new regulation came into force within the EU in 2022. Under the new "compliance" regime, organic producers in Sri Lanka will have to conform with exactly the same rules as those within the EU.
